


## Panel Discussion October Branch Event

Thanks to all our new and renewing members for your continued support for the AAUW Mission of advancing equity for women and girls through advocacy, education, philanthropy and research. National has just sent a letter highlighting new research which states that U.S. working women working full time were paid 80 cents for every dollar paid to men. This is up from 79 cents in the last data. At this rate it will take women 136 years to catch up! As an example of pay inequity "one year after college, women graduates make only 82 percent as much as their male counterparts". AAUW is working to raise awareness and close this gap. Let's continue to do our part by supporting AAUW.
