



Revisioning our Branch's Women's History scripts!

Our branch has been writing and publishing Women's History scripts for over 30 years. During that time, our format has gone from published books (*Profiles of Women, Vol 1-3*) to a single CD's with 106 scripts. Due to the marketing savvy of Nathalie Gosset, we have entered the sphere of digital downloading! All of our scripts are planned to be posted on a commercial platform called *Smashwords*.

A person or a school wishing to buy one script or 100 scripts will be able download the individual scripts to their computer. Our library will also include thematic bundles of scripts. Our first published bundle is called "Suffragists and Activists". A bundle costs less and the purchaser gets all the scripts on a similar topic. Smash-

words retains a small fee from each purchase but a large portion of the price comes directly to our branch. We are <u>https://aauwto-ca.aauw.net/e-store/</u>hopeful that the materials will reach more students,




