# Getting Involved...

### Women's Suffrage Project

California women won the right to vote in 1911, but it wasn't until 1919 that Congress passed the 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment (Susan B. Anthony amendment) granting American women in all states the right to vote. Thirty-six states were needed to ratify the amendment and that occurred in August 1920 with the vote of Tennessee.

The historic woman suffrage campaign should be a testament to the importance of all citizens to be active in our democracy. There will be many celebrations throughout the nation, and in the various states celebrating the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary. In California, a committee has been formed sponsored by the National Women's History Alliance (formerly NWHP) called **CA 2020 Women's Suffrage Project.** A preliminary organizing committee has been formed and I am serving on this committee along with many others from different organizations.

The CA 2020 committee is inviting elected officials, librarians, teachers, business leaders, community organizations, and volunteers to join together in celebrating this historic event. The goal is to have local supporters and volunteers in every California county planning activities to celebrate the centennial. If you are interested in being part of this centennial planning for Ventura County (and beyond), please let me know and I will send your name to the CA 2020 Women's Suffrage Project.
